a letter from the DIRECTOR & BOARD PRESIDENT

As we reflect on Fiscal Year 2024–2025, I am proud to share some of our most meaningful accomplishments—milestones made possible by your continued support and our exceptional team.

A major highlight this year was the addition of three new study rooms, designed to better meet the needs of our community. Requests for meeting rooms previously outpaced the space available, so the library prioritized our role as a hub for community initiatives. These updated spaces offer greater capacity and flexibility, providing welcoming environments for learning and collaboration.

We also began work on a new strategic plan, a roadmap that will guide us as we continue to evolve and respond to the changing needs of Wallingford. This forward-looking effort is grounded in community feedback and a deep commitment to innovation and accessibility.

Throughout the year, we maintained our focus on fiscal responsibility, ensuring that every dollar is spent with care and purpose. Much of our funding comes from Wallingford taxpayers, and we take that responsibility seriously. Especially when budgets are tight, patrons rely on library programs and services even more for everything ranging from movies and entertainment, SAT

study guides and language learning modules, graduation poster-making and tool rentals, career services, safe spaces for teens, and more. Cuts to library programs and services would result in the loss of significant community supports. Our goal is always to provide the greatest value to the Town of Wallingford, balancing excellence in service with sound financial stewardship.

Of course, none of this would be possible without you. We also rely on public support. Whether you've made a donation, completed our community survey, volunteered your time, or simply walked through our doors—you are essential to our work!

Finally, I must thank our incredible staff. We continue to attract and retain top talent, thanks in part to our strong reputation as a great place to work in a town that values all we do.

All of us together—our Board of Managers, staff members, and YOU our friends and supporters—have created a place that reflects endless possibilities and the best of what our town has to offer.

FACILITIES Ready for Our Close-Up!



Library visitors appreciate all the space Wallingford Public Library has to offer for quiet study and work—our Study Rooms are especially in high demand. This past year we added more, including one that fits up to eight people. With the addition of these new study rooms, the number of room users this past fiscal year was 3,392, up 10% from the previous year.

With more patrons spending time in the building than ever, we were glad to have 8 new HVAC Roof Top Units (RTUs) installed in the spring. These new units are more efficient than the old ones and will keep our V.I.P. visitors comfortable through all seasons.

TEENS Up and Coming Talent!



This year, more than anything, we heard that teens wanted the space and opportunity to be creative. So we went all in with our programming, giving the teens hands-on opportunities to learn new crafts and develop new hobbies. Fiber arts proved to be the most popular with the crochet and needle felting programs filling almost immediately. Dungeons & Dragons also remained popular so we expanded our resin dice making programs to include dice boxes as well. Additionally, we expanded the selection of D&D books in the YA nonfiction section for teens to use in their own campaigns. We also launched the Teen Library of Things and the D&D themed board game and Tabletop RPG Kit were among the most popular items.

ADULT SERVICES In the Spotlight!

This year, our adult programming was all about seeing the world from new perspectives. We had our most successful "One Book, One Wallingford" event to date, featuring Monica Wood's *How To Read a Book*. Highlights included our conversations on justice reform, two live bird programs, and a public reading by nationally renowned poet Reginald Dwayne Betts. We also continued our multicultural food series The Wallingford Table with events like "Cooking with Ana," "An Eastern European Carnival," and "A Dragon Boat Festival," sponsored by donations from the Great Give. We celebrated Pride with a shadow cast performance of *The Rocky Horror Picture Show* and launched new recurring programs such as ASL Conversation Group and International Movie Night.

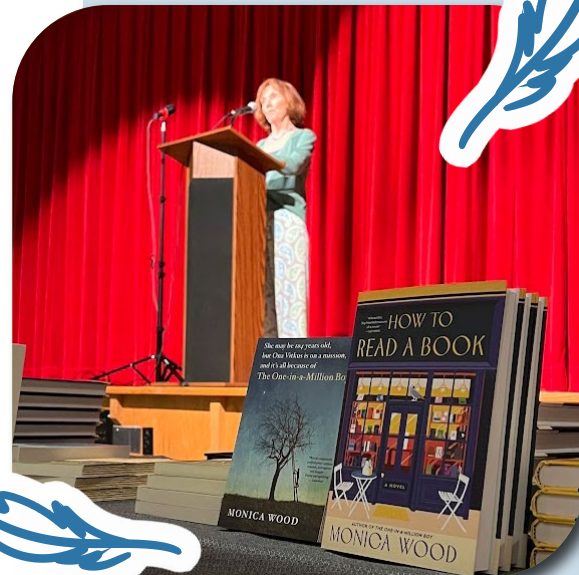

It's always a joy to welcome new Wallingford residents who would like to get their first Wallingford library card! We made it even easier to get a library card by moving the library card registration desk front and center stage in our Borrower Services Department. In addition, we added a new sorting area for delivery bins of items from other libraries so we can get materials back onto the shelf or in your hands as soon as possible.

The Borrower Services Department initiated a monthly column in *Words* and a video series on social media to showcase "Cardholder Perks" highlighting all the incredible things that you can do with your library card—from downloading e-books and music, to borrowing sewing machines, puzzles, video games and tools.

CATALOGING Behind-the-Scenes!

The Cataloging Department works diligently behind-the-scenes to process all new physical library materials—including books, magazines, DVDs, games, kits, and equipment—and maintain the online catalog. Preservation of existing materials, including repackaging and mending items as needed, is also a core responsibility of the department.

COLLABORATORY

Lights, Artists, Action!

The quilting and embroidery machines have always been among the Collaboratory's most popular pieces of equipment. To provide an even better experience for our textile enthusiasts this year we upgraded our embroidery and longarm quilting machines and added a fabric printer and pattern projector. The staff kept busy learning all of the new equipment first and then training patrons.

We welcomed our Digital Navigators as a library-funded service when our Town of Wallingford ARPA grant expired in October 2024. In addition to providing one-on-one digital skills training, assistance in obtaining low-cost home Internet connectivity, and long-term loan of Chromebooks to the public, our navigators partnered with Town Hall to assist town employees in the transition to Microsoft 365.

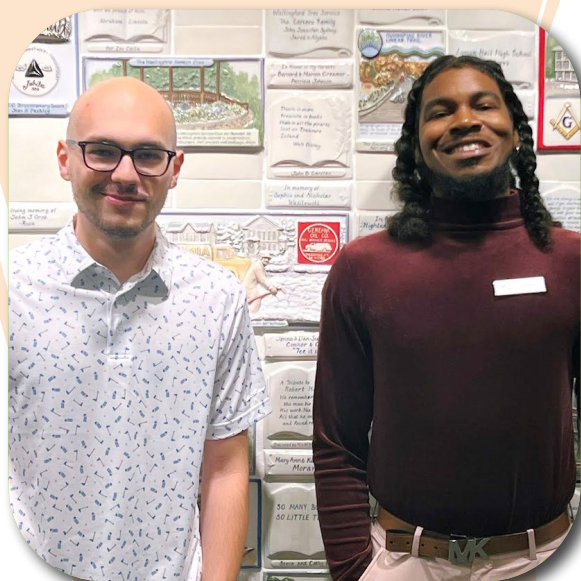

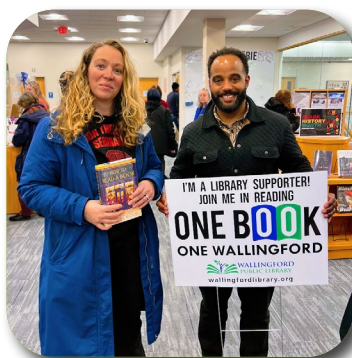
