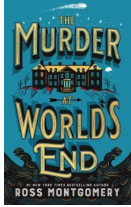


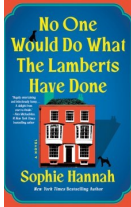

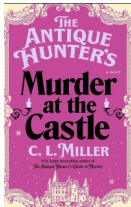

In 1979, tween best friends in England investigate the identity of the Yorkshire Ripper.



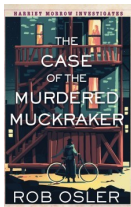
THE MURDER AT WORLD'S END

A family goes on the run after a neighbor accuses their dog of biting a young girl.



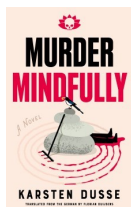
THE ANTIQUE HUNTER'S MURDER AT THE CASTLE

A 21-year-old female detective becomes involved in a murder case that is filled with scandal.



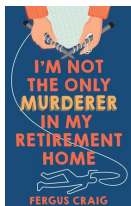
DIRTY METAL

A shady lawyer transforms his life through mindfulness and uses his newfound techniques to kill his way to the top.



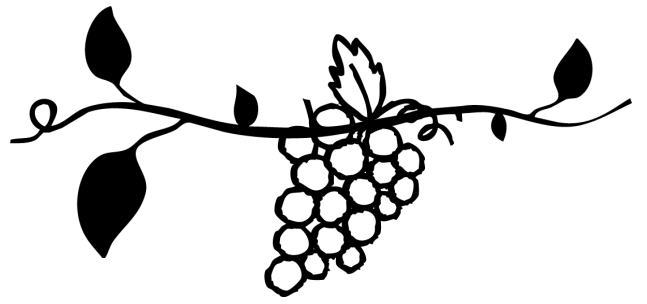
DEATH OF A GROOM

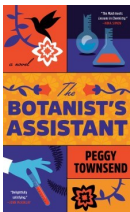

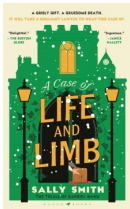

 In the 5th mystery featuring Queen Elizabeth II, the Queen is on the royal train when an unreliable witness claims to have seen a brutal murder.



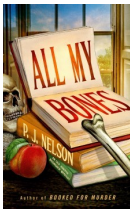
WHO KNOWS YOU BY HEART

 Two coders uncover a corporate secret while working on an AI-storytelling agent.



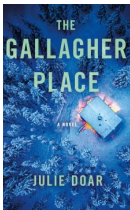
THE BOTANIST'S ASSISTANT

 A research assistant to a botanist decides to investigate a murder that takes place at the university where she works.



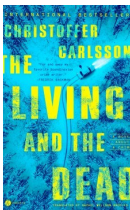
A CASE OF LIFE AND LIMB

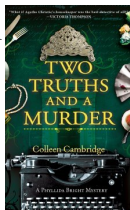
In this 6th Agatha Christie homage, Hercule Poirot struggles with a murder investigation during a New Year's Eve party.

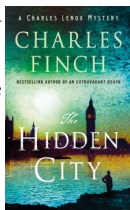
A real estate agent vanishes from a Rhode Island supermarket parking lot, and her nine-month-old daughter is left crying in a shopping cart.

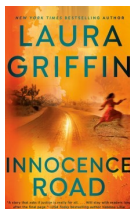
In the 15th Charles Lenox mystery, the sleuth starts noticing odd markings on several buildings in London.

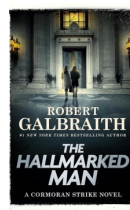
An aspiring novelist finds a possible plot in a murder case and is connected to F. Scott and Zelda Fitzgerald.

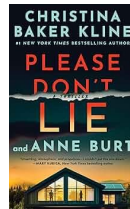
An assistant to the CEO of a Fortune 500 company plans a birthday party for her boss, which ends in chaos and murder.

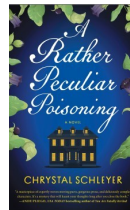
A young woman heads to the Adirondacks with her new husband for a fresh start, but the past won't let her go.

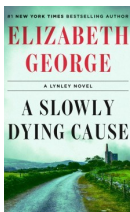
A magazine writer is hired to cover a top-tier wedding in Ireland for an ultra-wealthy family, and then the matriarch is found dead.

In the 22nd Lynley mystery, the inspector and Sergeant Havers head to Cornwall where mayhem has come a-calling with a "devastating pool of blood."

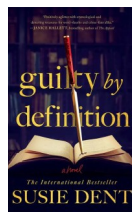

BY DAVID ROSENFELT (OCT 14)

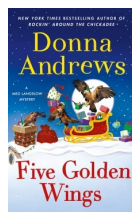
