





THE SHADOW STEP

An innocent man confesses to a crime, and then a murder happens that isn't really a murder.




THE TALKING BONE

A Nashville private investigator looks into the disappearance of an enigmatic indie rock star after she is shot on stage and vanishes from an ambulance.




MURDER BITES

A city transplant in a dog-obsessed small town becomes the prime suspect when the local dog walker is murdered.




PROBABLE CAWS

In the 39th book in the Meg Langslow series, Meg helps a friend who shelters rescued horses at his estate after a thug threatening the horses is murdered.




TIME TO BURN

Commercial time travel allows the wealthy to visit the past, but after a tourist disappears in 1941, the ripple effect is felt in the present day.




GOD'S COUNTRY




A small-town detective reopens a decades-old cold case, sending shock waves across generations of women in the area.


A union leader grapples with a collapsing paper mill strike and considers violence to help save her community.

BY JACK FRIDAY (JULY 14)


A stoner private investigator in Austin, Texas inherits a house and gets pulled into a murder mystery involving his uncle's death.



A mysterious stranger's arrival triggers a chain of secrets, lies and deadly events among the residents of a boarding house.




THE LIFEGUARD


MURDER AT THE HOTEL ORIENT

An American concierge at a secretive romantic hotel in Vienna must solve the murder of two guests.




RACHEL WEST AND THE FALLEN STARLET



A young working-class girl in 1979 Glasgow happens upon the body of a murdered woman.





A group of gardeners in a small town find a corpse buried in the community greenhouse.




RUBY FALLS

A young woman is caught up in a gruesome murder mystery after a publicity stunt in a deep underground cave goes dangerously awry.




THE SECRET LIVES OF MURDERERS' WIVES

Three women bond over their shared experiences of being married to convicted serial killers.




THE TREE OF LIGHT AND FLOWERS

Scotland Yard Inspector Ian Rutledge investigates a murder on the coast of Northumberland near the holy island of Lindisfarne in this 25th installment in the series.




SPELLBOUND BY MURDER

A former antique hunter returns to her hometown to investigate the suspicious death of her estranged mentor.




EVERYONE IN THIS BANK IS A THIEF

A tragic shooting in Chicago ripples through the community, affecting teachers, students and police officers.




MISSING





A spoiled young man forced to work at a sleepaway camp stumbles upon a murder mystery.




A VIOLENT MASTERPIECE
